# **Douglass Park Elementary** Parent and Family Engagement Policy/Plan and Procedures

# PART I-SCHOOL PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY/PLAN REQUIRED COMPONENTS

The Annual meeting was held September 28, 2023 6:00-7:30 pm as part of Family Bingo Night.

  Other opportunities to receive Title I information: recording of Title I presentation will be placed on the school's website, Virtual meeting with parents and staff via Zoom, school visits, Douglass Park's YouTube page 23 24 DPES Title I Presentation , and future events to receive information.
- C. Parents are given options of virtual meetings. Also in person meetings are scheduled early morning or even after school hours if needed.

This will be done to inform them regarding how the they can be involved in the education of their children; and be active participants in assisting their children to attain English proficiency; achieve at high levels within a well-rounded education; and meet the challenging State academic standards expected of all students ELL parents will receive testing plans for all students who are English learners; Parent information sessions to support language barriers; Educational partnership with ESL teacher and liaison.

Parents of ELL students will receive additional resources from the ELL program. They will be provided information in a language of their understanding.

Staff is available to conference with parents at the end of the instructional day, parents will be given opportunities to volunteer by contacting Parent and Family Engagement Liaison. Parents wishing to participate in their child's class and observation of classroom activities must receive approval from school administration.

Monthly and weekly communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand using newsletters, class DOJO, social media, and School Messenger phone calls to all families.

- Douglass Park's Parent Family Engagement Liaison will provide professional development with the purpose to improve teacher-parent relationships.

At Douglass Park Elementary, our K-3 students are assessed to establish students' reading levels. Students that require additional support, receive additional hours with a PALS tutor or small group instruction with their teacher. Our TDT services assist with students that struggle with self-regulation. The administration, parent family engagement liaison, and attendance task force will use data to identify at risk students and tier 3 students. For teachers that require additional classroom management supports, the Office of Youth Risk Prevention will provide intimate services and a series of professional development opportunities for the entire staff.

Coordinate and integrate parent engagement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parent engagement by:

- Collaborating as a feeder school with preschool for kindergarten transition program.
- Parent liaison will have daily hours for parents to visit the parent resource center.
- Parent liaison will provide a calendar of events to engage parents for participation and volunteering. Back 2 School Bingo Night /Annual Title I meeting.

  Make & Take w/Mom & Dad (Activities that families can work on at home)

The classroom teacher, liaison, and staff will work with the school to ensure information is printed in a language for parents to understand: Robocall, flyers, social media, and school marquee.

Literacy/math trainings provided by school instructional staff and parents

Douglass Park parents will complete parent surveys, volunteer surveys, and represent the school at the Title I Parent Advisory Board Meeting.

Douglass Park will partner with parents to present topics together and use the survey results to give parents the opportunity to facilitate training based on results of parent surveys.

- 2) May provide necessary literacy training from funds received under this part if the district has exhausted all other reasonably available sources of funding for such training. Title I funds will be provided to promote Reading Nights (twice a year), SOL Game Night, and collaborate for PALS Pails Pick-Up.
- 3) May pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with local Parent and Family Engagement activities, including transportation and childcare costs, to enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.

Title I funds will be used to purchase materials and supplies for P & FE events, workshops, etc.

reports on Douglass Park Elementary Parent and Family Engagement processes. In this meeting, there will be data review, an analysis of surveys, sign-in sheets, and verbal feedback.

- 7) May establish a district parent advisory council to provide advice on all matters related to Parent and Family Engagement in programs supported under this section. Douglass Park has three parents assigned to our division Parent Advisory Council. We also have more parents that have committed to serving on Douglass Park's Parent Committee. The parents will meet monthly.
